February Meeting

At the meeting held on February 26, 2013, Dr. Jennie Dutchak gave another interesting and informative presentation on the Saskatchewan Cemetery Project. She mentioned that this was still a 'work in progress' and any new contributions regarding information on cemeteries in Saskatchewan will be included in this project. She spoke about her individual contributions to this project.

In 1991, she published, *Ukrainian Ritual Breads*, Canadian Museum of Civilization, Hull, Quebec. In 1995, she published *Mamornitz: a history of a Ukrainian pioneer community in Saskatchewan, 1900-1995*. In 1997, she published, *Mamornitz revisited: one hundred years of a Ukrainian settlement in Saskatchewan, 1897-1997: including the school districts of Czernowitz, Dobronoutz and Oleksince and the community of Drobot. In 2002, Dr. Dutchak published the book, <i>Uspenska: A Historical Landmark of Saskatchewan, 100th Anniversary, 1902-2002*.

She was instrumental in the production of the historical documentary in August, 2010 entitled, *Mamornitz: A century of faith and tradition*. This documentary was presented in Saskatchewan at the 100th anniversary celebration of the Mamornitz community, with some 300 attendees. Dr. Dutchak submitted information on 19 records from the Chabajlo Cemetery, Insinger, Kamsack Region, Saskatchewan in March 9, 2012. These were settlers from Bukovyna.
