#### New at the National Library

The National Library of Canada has acquired two databeses which are of particular interest to researchers interested in family history in Quebec. These are:

These two databases on marriages and deaths in Quéébec are available on the second floor of the National Library/National Archives building (395 Wellington Street) at station 1 (center computer). Researchers can click on these icons on the computer and access each database. The instructions are in French but they are very easy to use. The information provided is basic but can be used as a guide to locate obituaries and other information from local newspapers. Searches for Ukrainian names have produced results.
